CASA

In 1916, food and drug officials in the Central Atlantic States organized for the purpose of improving coordination among local, state and federal government agencies. This group of individuals became a professional association known as the Central Atlantic States Association of Food and Drug Officials. Today its objectives continue to:

1. Promote and foster uniformity of laws affecting foods, drugs, devices, and cosmetics
2. Encourage and Promote enforcement of all applicable laws and regulations.
3. Encourage and support programs and work in cooperation with other professionals and industry groups to contribute to and advance consumer protection.
4. Provide technical training and professional development programs.
5. Encourage and promote cooperative enforcement programs among local, state, and federal agencies.
6. Cooperate with the Association of Food and Drug Officials and other organizations having similar objectives.
7. Foster and promote modernization of laws, regulations, policies, as well as, inspection and analytical techniques to validate changes and new developments in technologies used to manufacture and distribute foods, drugs, devices, and cosmetics.
8. Improve communications among government officials, industry representatives, academes, and consumers.

SERVICES & BENEFITS

Annual Educational and Training Seminar – A three-day training conference where regulatory officials, industry representatives, academes, consumers, and exhibitors present information about, but not limited to, food, drugs, devices, cosmetics, and environmental and public health concerns.

Training courses – The education committee develops, presents, and sponsors technical training and professional development courses. Continuing Education Units (CEU's) are offered if feasible.

Local Conferences – CASA is divided into eight geographical areas designated as local conferences. These local conferences are named:

Local conferences hold quarterly meetings, distribute newsletters and sponsor technical training programs. These activities encourage and promote communication and camaraderie between members.

H. Thompson Price Scholarship – A \$1,500 scholarship is awarded annually to commemorate the life and service of H. Thompson Price, Jr. who devoted more than 25 years to protecting the American consumer.

Participation in National Policy Development – Members can submit resolutions to change or improve policies effecting current food and/or drugs laws and practices. Resolutions are your chance to make your voice heard and to influence national policy decisions.
